The Carroll Moore Memorial Sundial honors the late Carroll Moore, a well-known local astronomer and long-time member of the Nebraska Wesleyan University faculty, and was made possible by a generous donation from the Moore family.

Carroll Moore was a full-time member of the Nebraska Wesleyan Department of Physics faculty from 1953 to 1988, and continued to serve Wesleyan as professor emeritus of physics until his death in 1996.

An interest in astronomy led Moore to travel throughout the world during his life to observe solar eclipses and Halley's Comet. In Lincoln, he gave hundreds of presentations on Halley's Comet in the public schools and influenced the construction of Hyde Memorial Observatory. He served as chair of the Hyde Observatory building committee from 1975 to 1990, and director of Wesleyan's Jensen Planetarium from 1963 until his retirement. Moore received his bachelor's degree from Doane College in 1939, and master's from the University of Nebraska in 1941.
